WELCOME TO KENMARE

Kenmare is a full service community that offers much for visitors, shoppers, and residents. Health care services, good schools, multiple churches, recreational facilities, and a wide array of businesses add to quality of life here.

- The old *Danish Mill* sets in the unique park square at the heart of Kenmare's downtown business district. The two-story tall windmill was built in 1902. Four large 18-foot vanes once captured the wind's power to grind wheat into livestock feed or flour for local farmers.

- To the immediate north of town is the *Kenmare Country Club*. It is a lush 9-hole grass green course with irrigated fairways and greens. Golfers can enjoy a scenic overlook of the Des Lacs Lake and valley from most of the course. Kenmare Country Club is one of the oldest courses in the state, established in 1917.

- The *Scenic Lake Road* (former days route of U.S. Highway 52) accommodates tourist traffic along the *Des Lacs National Wildlife Refuge* and lake. This route is designated as a *North Dakota Scenic Backway*. The 12-mile gravel road has nature trails for walking and wildlife observation, as well as the "Boat Docks" for kayaks and canoes. The refuge is a very popular destination for bird watchers from around the world. Call the refuge headquarters at 701-385-4046 for information or stop in the *Visitors Center* at the refuge headquarters located just across the lake from the downtown park square.

- With fitness in mind, a **Walking/Biking Trail** is a welcome amenity the community has to offer. The path is nearly one mile and encircles the Kenmare High School and sports complex. The walking path also extends along Sixth Street to the grade school.

- Another point of interest is the *Lake County Pioneer Village & Museum* located

in northeast Kenmare. It consists of five acres and over 20 buildings, including early day stores, a town hall, two one-room school houses, 1904 home, and a pioneer church. One of the newest additions is the *Military Museum* building and its vast array of items. The *V&R Toy Museum*, features scale model toy tractors and implements, some scratch-built by hand.

- Recreational facilities include outdoor basketball courts, indoor gymnasiums, softball fields, children's play parks, and walking trail. *Tasker's Coulee* is located two miles outside of town with a sheltered picnic area and numerous private picnic spots secluded in the trees - a fantastic area for hiking, hill climbing, and birdwatching.

- For evening entertainment, sit back with a hot buttered popcorn and take in a movie at the modern *Kenmare Theatre*.

- Surrounding the downtown park square are a variety of interesting stores. The *White Buffalo Soda Fountain* offers old fashioned sodas and ice cream using original turn-of-the-century soda fountain fixtures and furnishings from Kenmare's earliest drug store.

- *Peony Petals Floral & Gifts*, *Kenmare Drug*, and *Gathering Grounds* are three downtown businesses which offer quality gift items that are difficult to find anywhere else.

- Eating establishments include *City Limit's North Bar & Restaurant*, *Gathering Grounds* coffee shop, *M&K's Pizza Hub restaurant*, and *Cookies and Confections*. Quick food items are available at *City Limits Bar & Bottleshop*, *Beer Bob's* tavern, and Farmers Union Oil C-Store.

- Kenmare's modern convenience store on Highway 52, ***Cenex C-Store***, offers convenience food items, along with fuel for cars and trucks.

- Other retail and service businesses located at Kenmare include: **grocery store, hardware store, custom meat processing shop, banking institutions, a law office, coffee shops, accounting firms, tanning salons, hair salons, funeral home, insurance agencies, a financial services business, post office, newspaper and printing shop, truck and auto parts, and automotive repair shops.**

- Businesses around the community include **farm machinery dealerships, trucking companies, custom-made cabinet shop, lumber yard, an auto, trailer and golf cart dealer, welding shops, concrete redi-mix, graveling and construction, a metal sign and accessory manufacturer, and a cookies and confections baker.** Additional services include **electricians, plumbers, and home improvement contractors.**

- Kenmare is home base for several oilfield related service businesses, and a **workover rig manufacturer.**

- Medical facilities include a **hospital, medical clinic, chiropractic clinic, dental**

clinic, optometry clinic, physical therapy clinic, workout gyms, pharmacy, and a children's health services clinic.

- For overnight accommodations, Kenmare has the clean and comfortable 35-room ***San Way Ve Motel***, and the 42-room ***Quilt Inn*** along Highway 52. ***Kenmare RV Campground*** has full hookups for overnight camping just off Highway 52.

- If you are flying in for business or pleasure, the ***Kenmare Municipal Airport*** features a 3,800 foot paved and lighted runway.

Kenmare turns 125 years old in 2022



Kenmare in 1902 . . . This photo from 120 years ago shows some of Kenmare's phenomenal growth in just five years from the date the townsite was deeded in 1897. The downtown park square can be seen near the center of the photo as a barren block with dozens of new businesses surrounding it. The park square was the location of E.C. Tolley's claim shack, the only building in town in 1896. Six grain elevators can be seen jutting into the skyline along the railroad tracks, with the Des Lacs Lake in the background.

Danish Mill and Park on the Square

The founders of Kenmare built the city around a park, which now has beautiful trees, flowers, tables and benches to enjoy some time outside. Located in the center of the downtown park square is the Danish Mill which was built in 1902 on a homestead 11 miles north of Kenmare. It was used by area farmers for grinding grains into livestock feed and flour.

In 1959, the Mill was moved into the City of Kenmare and its restoration was completed in 1961. In 1965 the mill was

moved to the city park and given a face lift in 1996.

January 13th, 2019, the Danish Mill caught fire just after 6:00 am. The fire, ruled as arson, started inside the mill with visible damage such as a few holes in the siding and some broken windows.

The fire struck a nerve in the community but the private donation fund has helped a great deal for the complete restoration of the mill which was completed by June 2019.



Golf Course

The Kenmare Country Club is located 1/2 mile north of town and offers a beautiful 9-hole grass green course with watered fairways. It offers a scenic overlook of the Des Lacs Lake and the valley. The course presents a variety of challenges to golfers, whether they be a novice or seasoned player. The recently renovated clubhouse has a pro-shop and lounge that serves alcoholic and nonalcoholic beverages. Golf carts are available for rental. No tee time reservations are necessary. 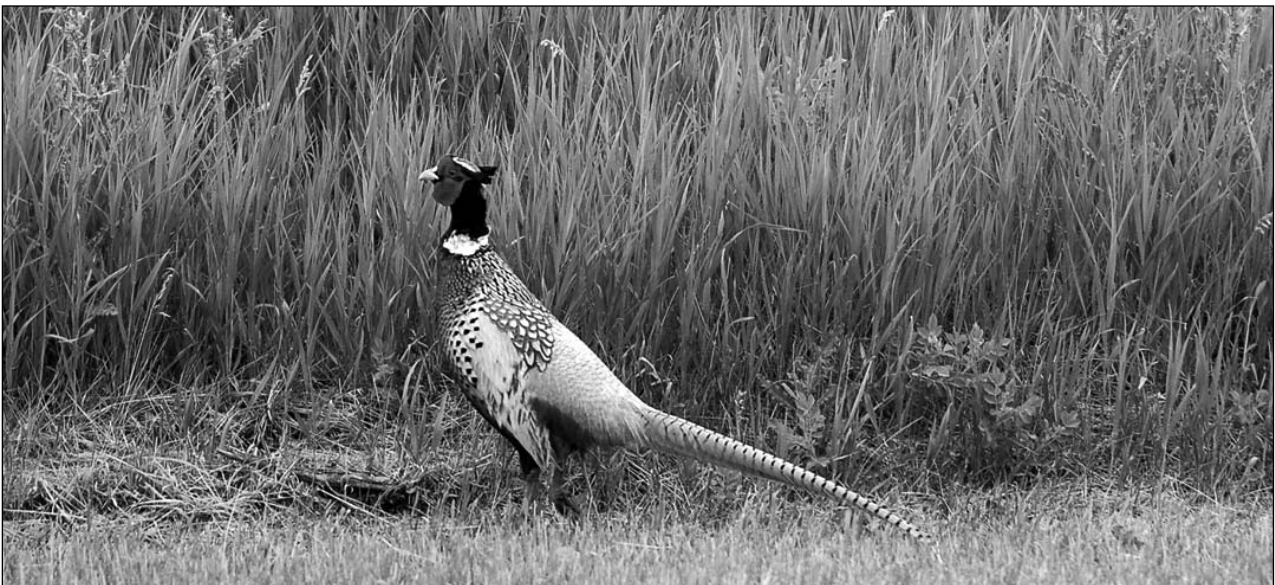
Scenic Lake Road

Kenmare's Scenic Lake Road of approximately 12 miles runs along the Des Lacs Lake from near Baden overpass to the picnic area and former boat landing about five miles northwest of Kenmare. The south end of the road intersects with U.S. Highway 52. The north end of the road intersects with Ward County #1.

The section running south of Kenmare was

once part of old U.S. Highway 52. The scenic road offers great access for bird watching, observing wildlife, biking, hiking, kayaking, canoeing.

Highlights along this North Dakota Scenic Backway include the 13 interpretive panels at pullouts and scenic overviews along the route.



Munch's Coulee Nature Trail

Located about five miles south of town just off the Scenic Lake Road, this trail is a designated National Recreation Trail. The first quarter-mile is paved, level and wheelchair accessible, with the remaining mile-long segment consisting of

mowed grass with some steep slopes. The trail provides breathtaking views of the Lower Des Lacs Lake, and the upland portion offers one of the best places on the Refuge to view native wildflowers and grasses.

Canada Goose Trail

This 7 1/2-mile scenic trail located along the northeastern section of Des Lacs Lake provides great opportunities to view migrating and breeding waterfowl.

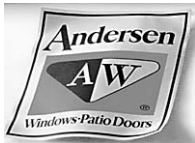
The trail is open to hiking, bicycling, cross country skiing and snowshoeing, with motorized traffic allowed for two weeks each fall, weather permitting, to view the beautiful fall foliage.

Tasker's Coulee Wildlife Observation Area

The Tasker's Coulee Wildlife Observation Area lies in a heavily wooded coulee south of the Des Lacs refuge headquarters and can be reached via Ward County Road #1A. This lighted area offers a covered shelter which was built by the CCC workers in the 1930s, picnic tables, grills, drinking water and restrooms, all for the public's day use.

Numerous rustic hiking trails allow visitors to stretch their legs and enjoy the flora and fauna of the coulee.

Overnight camping is not permitted.

Nearby woodlands are inhabited by forest

birds such as vireos, black-and-white warblers, black-capped chickadees and downy woodpeckers.

Boat Dock Day Use Area

The gravel road leading north from Ward County #2 for 5 miles (known locally as the Boat Dock Road) winds along the upper Des Lacs Lake through woodlands and coulee bottom habitat to a refuge Public Use Area-Boat Dock. Canoeing and kayaking are permitted, following refuge regulations.

This area offers opportunities for picnic-

ing, hiking, birdwatching and non-motorized boats in a beautiful lakeside setting. It features vaulted bathroom facilities, picnic tables, and a boat ramp with a dock.

The Boat Docks is maintained by the Des Lacs Refuge. The area may also be reached via Ward County Road #1. Use is restricted to daylight hours only.



Future Swimming Pool

This rendering from architect company Ackerman-Estvold features a bathhouse with a canopy for shade at its south end, along with public accessible restrooms. A wading/splash pool is to be located next to the main pool. The main pool also features

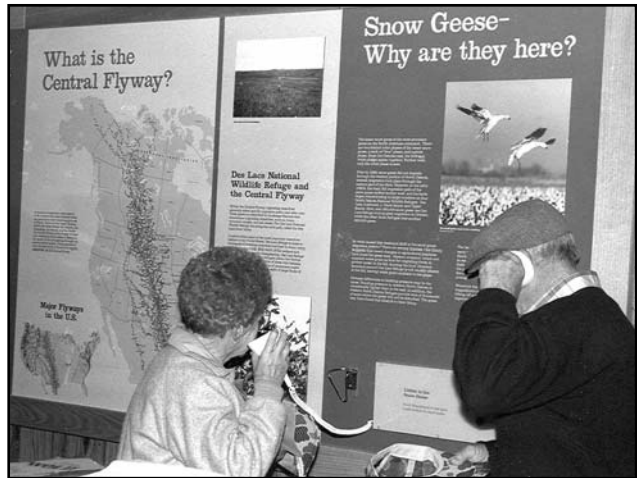

Des Lacs NWR Visitor Center

Interpretive displays are available at refuge headquarters and focus on early history of the area, habitat management, waterfowl production, grassland birds, grebes, sharp-tailed grouse, and butterflies. The refuge staff hosts a variety of special events and programs throughout the year. Please contact the refuge staff for more information about environmental education programs and learning sites. Hours are Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The refuge headquarters is located one mile directly across the lake from downtown Kenmare, one mile west on Ward County 1A, and can be reached by calling 701-385-4046.



Janell Art Studio

The Lakeview Art Club, Inc. occupies a renovated building on the Kenmare square that has had many uses since it was built in 1897.

The site now serves as a studio for about ten local artists.

The Janell Art Studio was named in memory of two charter members of the art club, Janet Coughlin and Vernell Hanson.

Lakeview Art Club members use the studio to create their art. Classes are also available for interested individuals.

The Janell Art Studio occasionally hosts small exhibits for private groups in addition to the major shows sponsored by the Lakeview

Art Club each fall and spring.

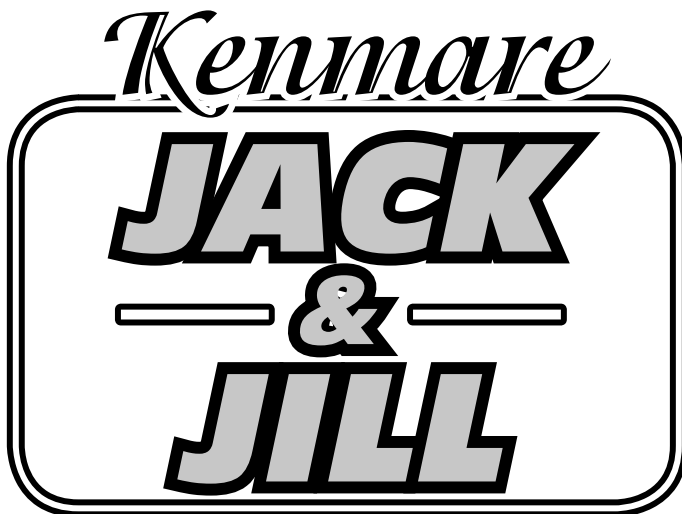

features an old-fashioned church service, children's games, log cutting contest, pig roast, live entertainment, and more!

Kenmare Theatre

The Kenmare Theatre shows current release movie titles

The smell of fresh-popped popcorn permeates the air of the totally renovated Kenmare movie theatre.

The Kenmare Theatre was reopened in the spring of 1999 in the same building that was home to the old theater for 50 years. The old is gone, replaced with new. The front of the building has modern glass doors. The lobby includes a full-service concession stand and handicap accessible bathrooms.

The theater’s viewing area features comfortable seats, each with its own cup holder. The walls are lined in maroon satin drapery. Moviegoers enjoy the show on a 10 foot by 20 foot screen, with a stereo surround-sound system. The theatre was upgraded in 2012 when the film reel projector was replaced with a new technology digital 3-D projector.

A painted mural from the original theatre was restored and fills a wall of the inner lobby.

“This is the nicest little theater in the state,” proclaimed the theater contractor who installed the equipment during the renovation. His words remain true today.

Show times are Friday and Saturday at 7:00 and 9:15 pm, and Sunday and Monday at 7:00 pm. Special show times and matinees are also scheduled. Call 385-4433 for current movie titles and show times. Private parties can book the theatre, too.

The Kenmare Theatre is classified as a “first-run move-over” theatre, and features current movie titles, many within two weeks of their release from the studios.

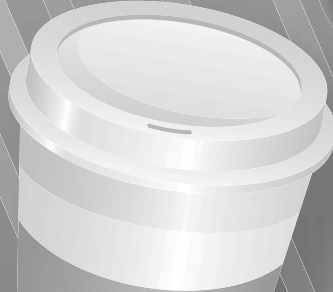

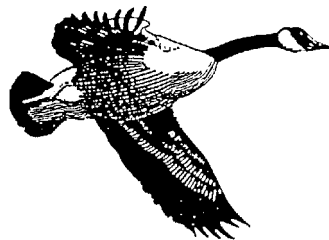

Kenmare Library

The Kenmare Branch Library offers books, magazines, DVDs, audiobooks, videocassettes and state-of-the-art computer, internet and wifi access to patrons of all ages.

Birding

Birding has long been a popular activity in the Kenmare area. The late Dr. Robert T. Gammell, nationally recognized for his knowledge of birds, was a medical doctor in Kenmare for 39 years. He and his wife Ann helped host the first convention of the American Birding Association in Kenmare in 1973.

Visitors can take advantage of many excellent opportunities for birding. Since 1935, 308 different species have been recorded in the region.

The three National Wildlife Refuges in the vicinity provide opportunities to view

a variety of both prairie and waterfowl species. The refuges have recorded 169 nesting species, with 150 of those species nesting regularly.



Upper Souris Refuge

The Upper Souris National Wildlife Refuge, located 34 miles east of Kenmare, furnishes a striking, panoramic view of the river valley. This can be seen from an auto route and adjacent hiking trails that ride the crest of hills west of an earth dam. The earthen dam separates valley marshlands from the lake formed behind the dam.

Named after the famed conservationist and cartoonist J.N. "Ding" Darling, Lake Darling is a favorite fishing ground for North Dakotans. Canoe trails are open to the public above and below the dam, giving canoeists an intimate view of Souris River habitats and marsh wildlife. The Refuge can be contacted by calling 701-468-5467.

KHS Rocks

Tradition of setting class year into a hillside has been going on since 1945

What's up with those numbers on the hills?

It is a question that countless strangers to the area have asked after driving through the valley south of Kenmare.

For more than 70 years, all but a few of the graduating classes of Kenmare High School have left their mark for posterity on the hillsides.

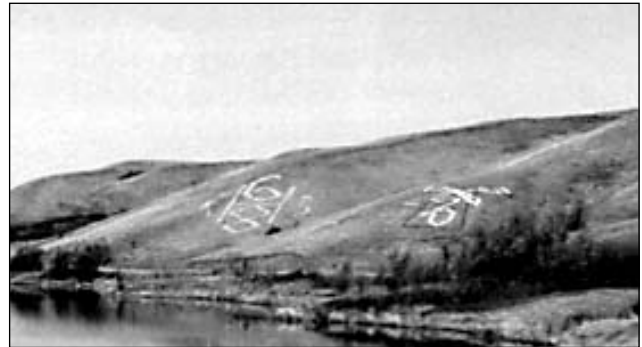
Each spring the seniors select a hill, gather with shovels, trucks, and paint brushes, then get to work. An outline of their class year is staked out. Then the sod is dug out and hauling in of field stones begins. When the trenches have been completely filled

with rocks, the project is finished off with a coat of whitewash or paint. For many years, Rock Day was an organized school event for seniors just before graduation.

Most of the KHS class-year rock monuments have taken shape on the hillsides from seven to eleven miles south of town along Highway 52.

Class years from '51 to present can be easily spotted as one cruises through the area near the Baden overpass. Years pass, but the numbers remain highly visible as the classes apply a fresh coat of paint during their reunions.

The first KHS rocks took shape in 1945. The students' rock graffiti on the hillsides was initially conceived as a diversion from less desirable graffiti painted on buildings and other structures around town.

Their class number is the furthest south from Kenmare, located along U.S. Highway 52, two miles southeast of Donnybrook. Keeping up the tradition, the KHS Classes of 2017, 2018, 2019 have also constructed their rock monument a couple miles west of Donnybrook. The KHS Class of 2022 rocks are located a mile south of the Baden overpass.

Area Fishing Holes

If fishing is for you, then grab your poles and head to one of the surrounding fishing holes in the area.

Mouse River Park is located 20 miles northeast of Kenmare. The park is 5 miles north of Tolley.

Carter Dam is about 5 miles south of Highway 5, on the east side of the Mouse River.

Lake Darling - Lake Darling is located on the Upper Souris Refuge, 34 miles east of Kenmare. It is open to fishing from 5:30 am until 10:00 pm daily. This lake contains northern pike, walleye, perch, bullhead and smallmouth bass. Camping is not allowed.

Also part of Lake Darling is the **Greene Crossing** approximately 15 miles north of Lake Darling on Highway 28.

Grano Crossing is located about 11 miles west of Lansford. This is between the Greene Crossing and Lake Darling.

Northgate Dam - Northgate Dam is located 6 miles north, 1 mile west, 2 miles north, and 1/2 mile west of Bowbells. It contains walleye, largemouth bass, bluegill, trout and crappie. A campground with electrical hookups is available.

Powers Lake - Powers Lake is located on the south edge of Powers Lake. It contains pike and perch. Campgrounds are available.

Smishek Lake - Smishek Lake is located 4 miles northwest of Powers Lake and contains walleye, perch, northern pike and bluegill. Campgrounds are available.

Residents and nonresidents, age 16 and older, must possess a valid North Dakota fishing license to fish any of these waters. Purchase fishing licenses online or over the phone. Licenses are valid for one year starting April 1st. More information is available online at gf.nd.gov/fishing.

Des Lacs National Wildlife Refuge

Des Lacs National Wildlife Refuge encompasses 19,544 acres and is one of several National Wildlife Refuges in the area managed mainly for migrating birds by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. It takes in 28 miles of the Des Lacs River Valley and contains extensive marshes, three natural lakes, and adjacent prairie and woodland habitats.

The Des Lacs Refuge is unique in its availability to the public. Its proximity to Highway 52 offers an excellent opportunity to observe, study, and photograph such birds as canvasbacks, pintails, marbled godwits, white pelicans, western grebes, and nearly 300 other species of birds. A photography blind located on a sharp-tailed grouse dancing ground provides a terrific



way to observe and photograph the prairie grouse during their spring dancing activities.

Great opportunities exist for viewing wildlife in marshes and lakes along the 7-mile scenic road that parallels the refuge south of Kenmare. A spur off this road, "The Brickyard Hill Road," crosses the refuge and winds its way to the bluff tops on the west side of the river valley, offering a bird's eye view of the Des Lacs Valley.

Des Lacs & Lostwood Wildlife Refuges

Wildlife observation is permitted year-round in all open public use areas, nature trails and the auto tour route.

The Refuge staff hosts a variety of special events throughout the year. Contact the Refuge office for information about environmental education programs and learning sites.

In order to protect the Refuge's wildlife and habitat management objectives, some activities are prohibited, including use of all-terrain vehicles and snowmobiles, camping, unleashed pets, horseback riding, fishing, geocaching, swimming and littering.

The Des Lacs NWR is open to deer and upland game hunting, in designated areas during designated hunting seasons with proper licenses. Non-toxic shot is required for upland game hunting. Persons possessing, transporting or carrying firearms on the Refuge must comply with state and local laws.

Equal opportunity to participate in programs and activities on the Refuge is available to all individuals, regardless of physical or mental

ability.

Lostwood National Wildlife Refuge, 20 miles west of Kenmare, is perhaps the best example of mixed grass prairie pothole land remaining in the U.S. The rolling hills and numerous wetlands of this 26,900-acre refuge were sculpted by the Wisconsin Glacier. Lostwood is one of the best places to find unique prairie birds such as Baird's sparrow, Sprague's pipit, and sharp-tailed grouse. A sharp-tailed grouse dancing ground blind is available, along with hiking and vehicle trails through the refuge.

The 5,577-acre Lostwood Wilderness area, part of the Lostwood Refuge, is open for birding, hiking, and photography year round, including cross-country skiing and snowshoeing during winter. The Refuge can be contacted by calling 701-848-2722.

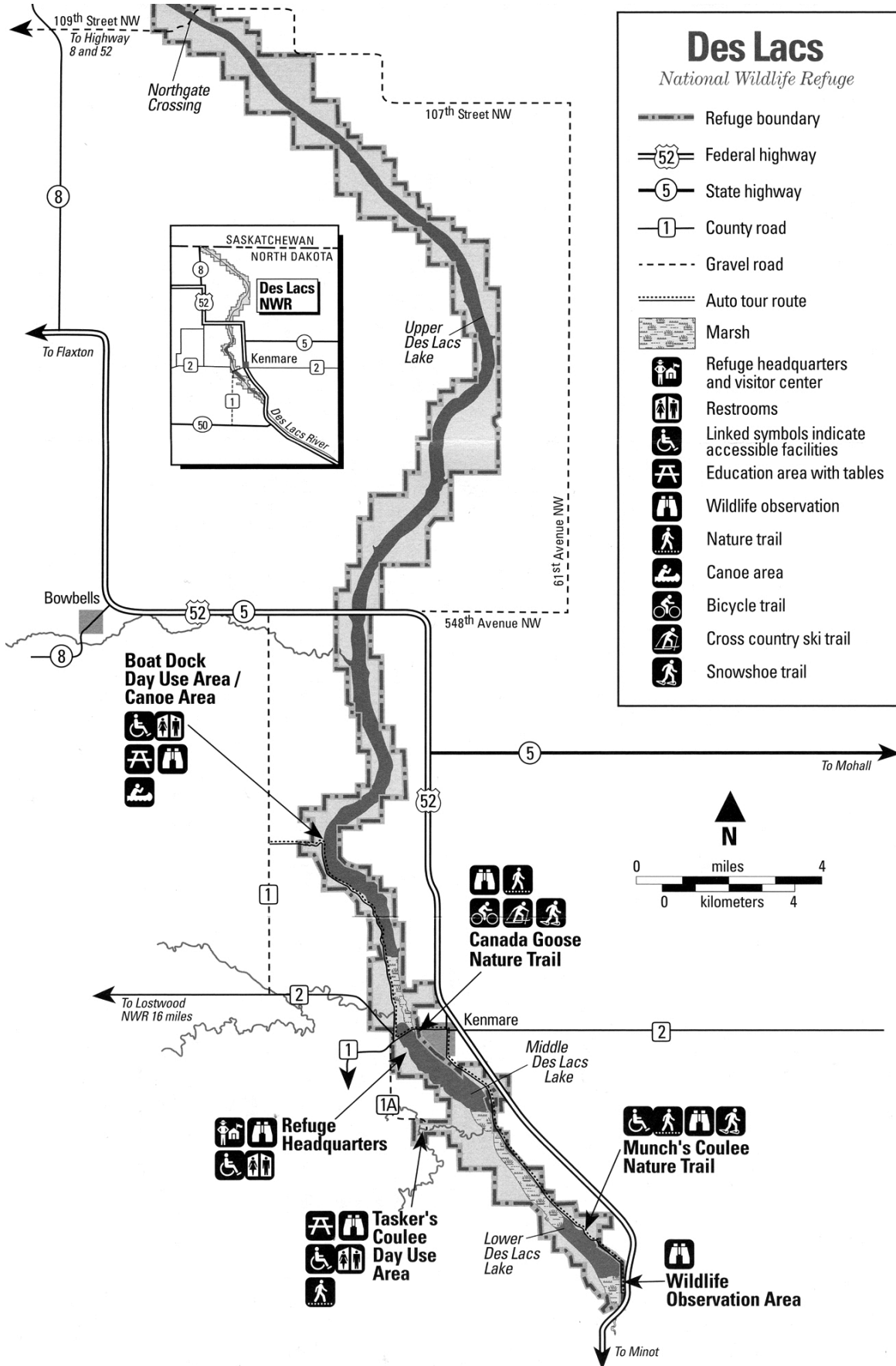

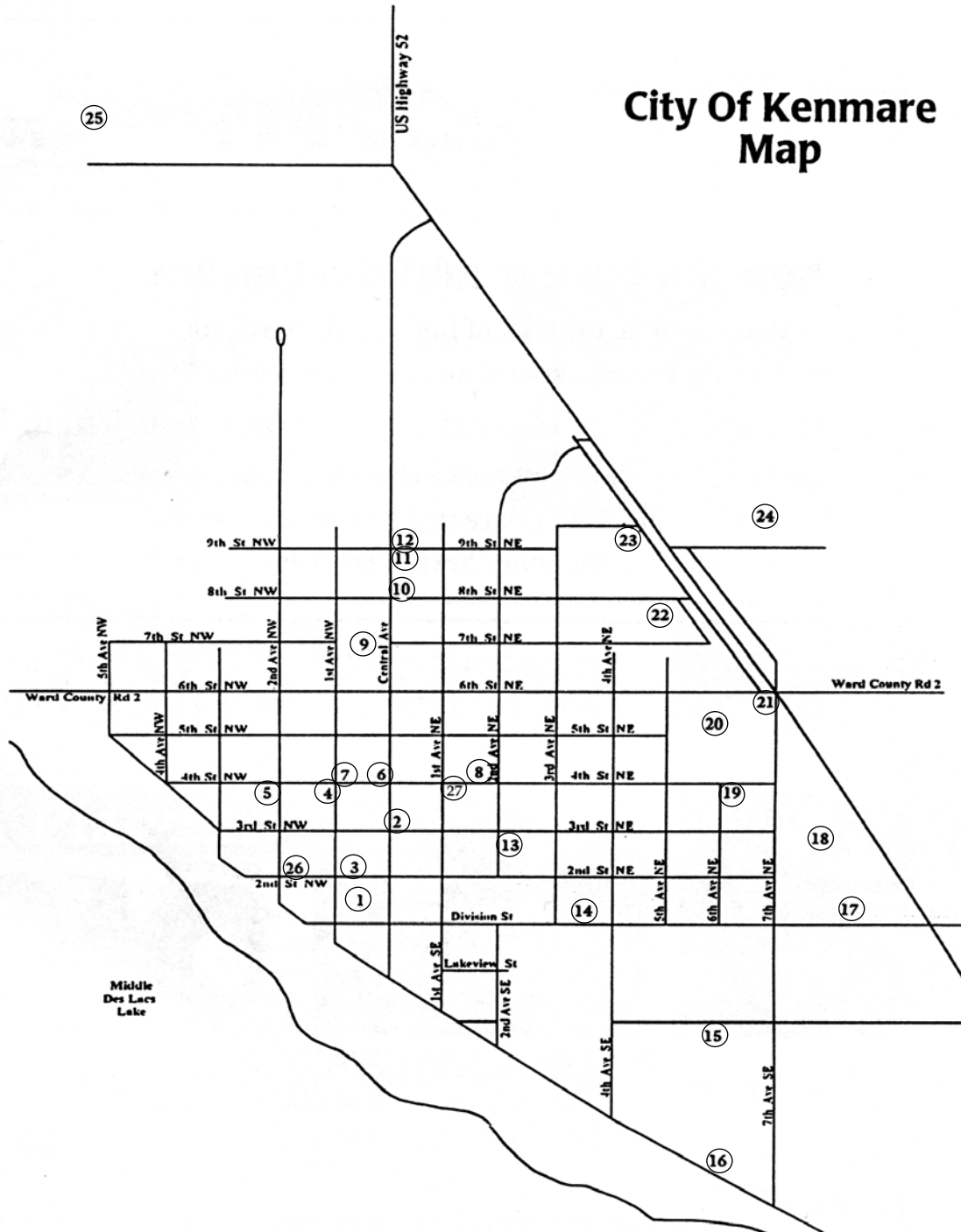

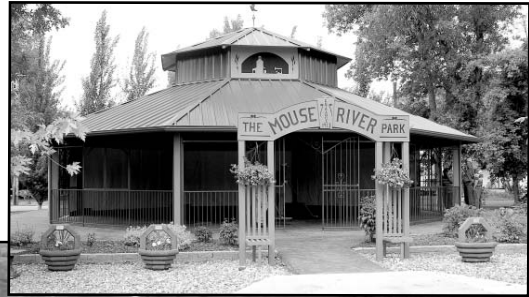
